Hive Calendar

Examine, Feed if necessary

On the first 55 F+ afternoon, go through hives briefly: clean hive bottom boards and clean out dead hives. Feed hives that will not otherwise make it to summer. Feed all hives in order to medicate with fumagillin (Fumidial B).

Nectar flow/Pollen:

Crocus, Heather, Skunk Cabbage, Pussy Willow (pollen), Maple, Apricot
