October Activities: Prepare for winter

Install mouse guards, tip hives slightly forward to ensure dry conditions. If used, Formic Acid, Coumaphous, and Apistan must be removed before winter. Feed or combine any hives that are too light to survive until early next summer. Bottle and sell honey and beeswax. Evaluate this year's hive management results and plan for next year.



PSBA Beekeeping Classes: Learn "How to Become a Hobby Beekeeper" PSBA is sponsoring two beginning beekeeper classes for 2012, in February and March. Class content will include: honeybee physiology and behavior, beekeeping equipment, procedures and best practices, diseases and parasites, and related topics. Classes are taught to a beginner's level of understanding and (NEW!) will include the Washington State Beekeeping Association's Apprentice Beekeeper test booklet. Each class consists of 10 classroom hours divided into successive Saturdays and a 'hands on' session at the club apiary in mid-April (date tbd). Advanced registration preferred. Please pay the club treasurer, Bruce Becker, \$50 for enrollment in one of the classes.

First class: Saturday 25th of Feb. noon to 5 in Visitor's Center large room (arrive 15 minutes early). And Saturday 3rd of Mar. noon to 5 (arrive early) **Second class:** Saturday 17th Mar. noon to 5 in greenhouse (arrive 15 minutes early). And, Saturday 24th Mar. noon to 5 (arrive early)

PSBA donation to Honeybee Research

The PSBA board has been considering various donation opportunities which align to our association's mission. Options for this year's allotted donation funds included advocating planting of nectar producing trees in Seattle, donating to the UC Davis Honeybee genetics program or the WSU Honeybee Research Program. In the end, it was decided to that all of the \$4000 allotted monies will be donated to the WSU Honeybee Research Program. Current research by the program includes: monitoring seasonal variation in *Nosema ceranae* infestations, molecular characterization of *Nosema* species in the Pacific Northwest, evaluation of interactions between parasites and pathogens and examining sub-lethal effects of chemical residues in the hive and the environment.
